*Camp New Friends (CNF), located in Harrisonburg, Virginia, adjacent to the magnificent Luray Caverns, offers children and teens with neurofibromatosis (ages 7-16) seven days and six nights of summer fun and social connections. CNF is sponsored by Children's National Medical Center in collaboration with Neurofibromatosis, Inc. **Camp New Friends provides opportunities for children to build self-esteem, gain independence, and establish friendships with other children and staff who live with the condition.***

At Camp New Friends, children share the experience of being part of a team, while learning and having fun in a safe, exciting, and supportive environment.

Program

Campers participate and choose from activities including hiking, arts and crafts, canoeing, teams sports, a ropes challenge course for building teamwork and self confidence, camp Olympics, swimming, yoga, archery, campfires, cooking, movies, drama, leadership training, and transitional youth programs. Support groups and educational programs promote knowledge, skill development and social connections. At CNF, children and teens gain personal strengths, a sense of self-worth, and a better understanding of their condition.

Staff

Camp New Friends' staff includes a pediatric neurologist, social worker and physical therapist, nurse, genetic counselor and psychologist from Children's National Medical Center, in addition to trained counselors carefully selected for their genuine interest in children and teens. Many counselors are college students and professionals with neurofibromatosis. Campers benefit from their experience, knowledge and understanding.

Registration Information

For as little as \$750 per camper, children experience a week-long overnight camp filled with adventure, laughter and friendships. The rustic cabins are air conditioned and comfortable. Payment plans and partial scholarships are available to eligible campers. Camp New Friends will make a strong effort to accommodate any child with NF who wants to attend. Please complete the registration form on the reverse side and send it with your non-refundable deposit. You will receive an application package in the mail.

Submit the form to Brainy Camps at Children's National Medical Center. If your child is new, an interview will be scheduled.

Cost

The cost is \$750 per camper, if deposit is received by April 1 and application is received by June 1, 2010. See details on the Registration Form on the back.
